TACOMA, WASH.— Tacoma Arts Live presents emerging Cuban vocalist, percussionist, and songwriter Daymé Arocena for one night only on Sunday, March 17 at 7:30 p.m. at the historic Rialto Theater. Daymé and her band will perform original compositions featuring Afro-Cuban rhythms, Santerian chant, and call-and-response with the audience. <u>Tickets are on sale now starting at \$19</u>.

<u>Daymé Arocena</u> effortlessly blends traditional Santerian chant, jazz stylings, contemporary R&B influences, and Afro-Cuban rhythmic complexity. Her passion for the musical traditions of her homeland is obvious. She won the 2015 Juno Award for the best jazz album, as a member of the jazz band Maqueque performing with Canadian musician Jane Bunnett. In 2016, she appeared on <u>NPR's Tiny Desk concert series</u>.

At every performance, audiences can participate in lively call-and-response chants. "Scat-singing over her trio's swaying rhumbas and cha-cha-chas," (DownBeat), Daymé's impact upon the history of Cuban music is undeniable.
